

Chapter 5. Volunteer Bartenders Requirements & Duties **(Please give to Volunteer Bartender)**

We strongly encourage you to have a team of one guy and one gal to manage beverages! People who overindulge are often more easily managed by someone of the opposite gender.

Requirements:

1. trustworthy, friendly, fun, responsive & organized.
2. incredible diplomacy skills, social skills, and mixed martial arts skills.
3. able to deal with the impaired with a big friendly smile
4. 21 years old and provide photo proof of age.

Responsibilities Include:

1. May hold party host's hand through the planning and ordering process.
2. Will arrive an hour before event and receive product. Recruit ushers to be your "happy bouncers," if needed.
3. Set Up Bar Area
Table(s) with Glassware, Breathalyzer & Signs
Arrange horse troughs to hold ice, beer, sodas and water in proper places, behind tables
Stock troughs with ice & product
4. Check Photo ID's and distribute products to sober adult guests with charm, flair and laughter.
5. Refuse with charming elegance, elan, panache, control and command to serve alcohol to persons under 21 years old or who are visibly intoxicated
It is unlawful to give alcohol to anyone under 21 years old, or to anyone who is visibly intoxicated.
Anyone providing alcohol to persons under 21 years old or who are visibly intoxicated is fully liable for any damages or injuries that the under age or intoxicated person may cause to someone else.
6. Manage inventory In case of emergency, buy more product as budgeted by party hosts.
7. Monitoring the sobriety levels of drinkers:
Reminding guests that at 8,000 feet, we oxidize alcohol much more slowly, as there is not enough oxygen!
In other words, at 8,000 feet it takes much less alcohol to make you stupid than at lower altitudes!
Inviting drinkers to play with the breathalyzer.
Educating Breathalyzer players about the consequences of DWAI and DUI in Larimer County.
8. Will deal with those who have had too much to drink, using guile, cunning, intrigue and the ushers or other helpers to talk friends into removing car keys from the afflicted.
9. Sharing with the afflicted the names of the Sheriff Deputies who will be patrolling the local roads.

10. Working with ranch staff, having list of rooms available here and/or nearby, and arranging transportation to those rooms.
